BMW World of Golf 2024 to tee off in Singapore.

The country's best amateur golfers will compete for a place at the BMW Golf Cup World Final in 2025.

Singapore. BMW World of Golf, the largest BMW Golf Series in Singapore, returns in April with three local qualifying rounds over the course of April to June at Sentosa Golf Club, Singapore Island Country Club, and Tanah Merah Country Club. The BMW Golf Cup National Final is expected to take place from 4 to 6 September.

A total of three winners¹ from the BMW Golf Cup National Final will go on to represent Singapore at the World Final that will take place in 2025.

"We are proud to have been one of 33 countries at this year's BMW Golf Cup World Final in South Africa," said Mr. Lars Nielsen, Managing Director, BMW Group Asia.
