New Flights from Debrecen to Leipzig and Malta starting late March

Universal Airlines will launch two round-trip flights a week on the Debrecen-Leipzig route from March 30, creating a direct connection between the two cities home to the

automotive factories of the BMW Group.

From March 30, Maltese Universal Airlines will launch a direct flight on Thursdays and Sundays on the Debrecen-Leipzig route. In recent years, a strong working relationship has developed between employees of BMW Group Plant Leipzig—celebrating 20 years of operations this year with 3.75 million BMW and MINI vehicles manufactured—and BMW Group Plant Debrecen, where the first model of the revolutionary Neue Klasse generation will start rolling off the production line at the end of this year. This connection will be further strengthened by the

direct flight between the two cities.

Universal Airlines will operate the Debrecen–Leipzig route using a De Havilland Canada Dash 8 aircraft with 78 seats. The first flight to Leipzig will depart from Debrecen International Airport

on 30 March.

In addition to Leipzig, Universal Airlines will also operate round-trip flights from Debrecen to

Luga, Malta, on Thursdays and Sundays.

"The new Universal Air flights build a bridge between Debrecen and Leipzig, facilitating travel not only for our regularly commuting employees but also creating new opportunities for businesses and residents of both cities to explore each other's regions. As a Maltese airline, we are especially pleased that Universal Air is also launching a direct flight to its home country, making one of Europe's most popular holiday destinations easily accessible to residents around

On an area of more than 400 hectares in Debrecen, located in the north-eastern part of Hungary, the BMW Group is building a complete vehicle factory with a press shop, body shop, paint shop, assembly and battery module assembly. The company is investing more than €2 billion (HUF 820 billion) in the site, which will manufacture all-electric vehicles only, starting from 2025. The plant will produce approximately 150,000 cars per year. The model manufactured in Debrecen will form the basis of the NEUE KLASSE, a new vehicle architecture for all-electric vehicles.
