History

The regulations were changed at short notice and the development team under Gordon Murray had just four months to develop a new racing car for the 1983 season. Nelson Piquet clinched victory in the first race in Brazil. A mid-season revision improved aerodynamics as well as providing more power. Nelson Piquet turned out to be a consummate professional in his careful handling of the sensitive turbo engines. He only ever drew on the amount of power needed to hold a good position. In the final race in Kyalami, third place was sufficient for him to make history as the first world champion in the turbo era.
