History

At the end of the 1920s, BMW was competing in international races against the overwhelming strength of fast English racing machines. At the end of the racing season in 1928, two works vehicles equipped with superchargers were available for the first time. Starting in 1929, BMW was successful in setting up numerous speed records using these vehicles fitted with oversized and linked brakes. The company also achieved a host of national and international victories.
