Clayton Williams takes third podium of the series

MINI USA and the MINI John Cooper Works <u>Team</u> landed a podium finish in the Touring Car A (TCA) class of the <u>2021 SRO TC</u> America series this weekend at Road America in Plymouth, Wis. 19-year-old racer Clayton Williams of Oakley, Calif., piloted the #62 MINI JCW to a third-place finish in Race 1 of the weekend after starting on the front row for the first time in the series.

"He fought hard the whole race to keep that third position and get us on the podium.
